Además, pidamos estar atentos a los signos de los tiempos para que interpretemos rectamente su voluntad y la pongamos fielmente por obra.

El Papa Francisco dirigió muchos mensajes durante la jornada mundial de la juventud realizada en Panamá durante 5 días.

Parte de los mensajes realizados a continuación:

Francisco clamó contra el intento de nuestras sociedades de "tranquilizar y adormecer a los jóvenes para que no hagan ruido, para que no se pregunten ni pregunten, para que no se cuestionen ni cuestionen".

"Qué fácil resulta criticar a los jóvenes y pasar el tiempo murmurando si les privamos de oportunidades laborales, educativas y comunitarias desde donde agarrarse y soñar el futuro", en un mundo "que no está dando raíces ni cimientos a los jóvenes".

La vida de salvación que regala Jesús no es "una salvación colgada 'en la nube' esperando ser descargada", ni una "aplicación" nueva o un ejercicio mental fruto de técnicas de autosuperación, tampoco un tutorial con el cual aprender la última novedad, "sino una invitación a ser parte de una historia de amor que se entreteje con nuestras historias".
