The McKenna Center serves homeless men and provides shelter, training, drug and alcohol counseling, emergency food, rental, and utility assistance, and most importantly, a place where men can regain their self respect.

Their pro-life activities have assisted thousands of women in the past twenty years with material, emotional, and spiritual needs in the MD and Washington, DC areas. As May is the month of Mary, please consider donating wipes and diapers and praying for these mothers. All diaper sizes are useful but they are very low on size 5 and 6. There will be a marked bin in the back of the church for your donation. This is the last weekend of the collection - thank you to all who have so kindly donated.

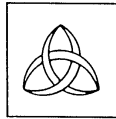
