Following the opening prayer, the FC members welcomed Deacon John Class as our newest participant. The pastor then highlighted two items: first, faith direct contributions are steady and provide consistent resources to help defray operating costs for the parish and ministries. (Fr. Mark expresses a thank you to all who participate.) Second, a parishioner's proposal to install a columbarium on St. Bart's property will undergo study and analysis. A summary of the parish 2017-2018 annual financial results will be shared with the community this month. The youth and education fund has been re-positioned to increase cash and short term instruments. In conclusion, Fr. Mark summarized the most recent progress report on the School Strategic Plan, a copy of which was made available to all FC members. The next Finance Council meeting is scheduled for November 29th at 7:00 am in the Rectory.

As a quick reminder –

Basketball has divisions based on age (no longer grade level) and gender and works as follows:

- 18U – Anyone who is 18 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). These teams may include any girls in high school because there is no 16U team.
- 16U – Anyone who is 16 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Only Boys Team).
- 14U – Anyone who is 14 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). Typically this includes 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders.
- 12U – Those who are 12 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). Typically this includes 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders.
- 10U – Those who are 10 and under as of Nov. 30<sup>th</sup> of 2018 (Boys + Girls Teams). Typically this includes 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders.

For those in Kindergarten and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, we will have an intramural program similar to last year at the school and will be held in the gym on Saturday mornings beginning in January.
